ARTICLE TWO

For the purpose of this Agreement:

- 1. Ine Parties hereby establish a United States-Angola Council on Trade and Investment ("Council"). The Council shall consist of representatives of each Party. The Angolan side shall be chaired by the Ministry of Commerce of the Republic of Angola; and the United States' side shall be chaired by the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative ("USTR").
